

7 CLOS ST AIGNAN

Rue Jean Bordier

Railway (inauguration in 1846) Its implantation led to the demolition of the boys' school.

- **41**, stone staircase leading to an attic Croix des Rachats in wrought iron. After the barn was extended the cross became encased in the gable.

- **74**, a large courtyard due to successive extensions. At the front, a small wine growers house and its cellar. A stone staircase leading to the house and the attic.

- **82**, an additional attic. The windows have disappeared leaving just the openings.

- **84**, winegrower's house dating from the first third of the 16th century. The overflow from the sink to the left of the door.

- **90**, entrance to the farmyard courtyard with its carriage door flanked by two stone pillars and its door for pedestrians. Sculpted stone cornice.

- **107**, milestone marked 1K (kilometre), the distance to the Foinard crossroads (?)

- **111**, former playground of the girls' school. The building is at the far end, parallel to the playground.

- **142**, vineyard house and its partially conserved vineyard.

- **148**, a wine grower's house belonging to the former Bruère vineyard which was surrounded mainly by hedges. At the end of the 18th century it covered a surface of 3 hectares composed mostly of vines.

8bis LES CONSTANTS

The monument was inaugurated in June 1871 on the grave of the 70 soldiers who died during the fighting of 7th December 1870.

It was demolished in the 70s.

Rue de Villeneuve

- **45**, at the far end on the left, in front of the gates, the former protestant.
