

1 BAULETTE

- 300 metres away on the right of the levee, the former grazing pastures of Baule.

In the middle of the 20th century the Baule Mauve originated at the foot of the hillside before drying up.

- 800 metres away on the left of the levee, the remains of the two buttresses of the wooden footbridge that led to Baule Island.

2 LE VAL

To the right of the levee, the former grazing pastures of the seigniorie of Baule.

- 1828 – 111 hectares of fields and pastures mainly in the valley.

At the angle of the Chemin de Tripot you can still see a willow bush. Its branches were used to attach the vine shoots.

- 1828 – 15 hectares of willow, mostly planted on the bank of the Loire.

3 LE BOURG

LE PORT

The former ford where domestic animals would come to drink (today there is a bridge)

- Remains of the slipway


- The so called "watering place bridge", mid 19th century.

- Underneath the bridge, the blocked up entrance to the first level of the cellar.

4 LA SEIGNEURIE

On the left side of the road, the surrounding wall of the former seigniorie.

Rue Abbé Pasty

- 113, the former seigniorie farm
At the crossroads of the rue des Grands Champs and Abbé Pasty the former village square.

- 115, the former Café du nord.
Segmentally arched window, second quarter of the 18th century.

- 117, pestone carved doors for carriages and destrians. Decorative lyres on the two metal gates which open on to the former premises of the Music Association.

5 L'ÉGLISE

Rue Abbé Pasty

- 114, former farm which has conserved its two stone pillars and its carriage doors. Near to the crossroads, the wooden Foinard cross and its stone monument to the dead.


6 LA MAIRIE

- 16, decorated skylight pediment and sculpted stone cornice
Opposite number 16, the former girls' school, second half of the 19th century.
